



LABRADOR RETRIEVER ORIGIN

The Labrador Retriever can be traced back to the 1500s. Newfoundland in Canada was where the breed was first introduced. Small water dogs were crossed with the Newfoundland dog breed, resulting in the St. John's Water Dog or Lesser Newfoundland. These canines were trained by local fishermen to jump into cold water and retrieve fish that had fallen off their hooks.

Despite the existence of other dog breeds similar to the Labrador Retriever, the breed remained popular in Newfoundland until the 1830s.



LABRADOR RETRIEVER PERSONALITY

Labrador retrievers are sociable, outgoing, and high-spirited companions with plenty of love to give. Numerous owners seem to believe their Labrador has a sense of irony, and some Labradors are particularly playful throughout their lives. Others, especially when young, can be smarmy, awkward, and bubbly. Of course, temperament, abilities, and general demeanour differ between individuals. But, more importantly, the Labrador has been separated into two distinct varieties over the previous half-century.

We'll examine those here because not every Labrador is suitable for every family, and some households are better suited to one more than the other. Some characteristics are determined by which Labrador Retriever breed it comes from.

LABRADOR RETRIEVER APPEARANCE

The Labrador Retriever's distinctive characteristics are well known. Its more definitive features are softened by a sympathetic demeanour and soft ear flaps. It has a large skull with "chiselled" characteristics. Its physique is muscular and robust, with a tail that tapers.

Individual hairs are straight, and the coat has a gleaming surface. In the coldest water, a Labrador's thick undercoat and water-resistant topcoat keep it warm.

ADOPTING A LABRADOR RETRIEVER

When browsing for Labrador Retrievers for sale, look for the following:

- ✔ Trusted reviews of breeders with a longstanding history
- ✔ Breeders with infrequent litters. This indicates a breeder is taking the appropriate safety measures.
- ✔ Breeders who have a lot of knowledge with regard to the particular breed. These breeders should know the breed like the back of their hand.
- ✔ Breeders who encourage you to meet the dog's parents.
